#### Curriculum overview

Throughout Year 11 and 12, the underlying service guarantee is to provide students with the opportunity to attain their Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE), or Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA) as appropriate. These pathways will be explained more throughout Year 10 in preparation for Year 11 and 12. Beyond this, students may choose a pathway that leads into University, work, or further training at the completion of Year 12; or a blended pathway that ultimately leaves options open. Through the Year 10 Careers program and Senior Training and Education Plan interviews (SET Plans), students will be given guidance and support to choose the best pathway for them – either pure ATAR/University bound, aiming towards a trade or employment, or a blend of both to work towards further training or employment.

The aim in Year 10, therefore, is to prepare students for the two-year commitment to learning that their Year 11 and 12 courses of study will take. Our philosophy is to provide students with pathways and experiences in Year 10 that will ultimately help to ensure that students are in the 'right' subjects at the start of Year 11, and therefore able to have the most stable path towards their post-school options. By experiencing subjects in Year 10 and preparing students more explicitly for their Year 11 and 12 study, we hope to offer students a 'try before you buy' opportunity without locking anyone into a set pathway. Subject changes will be encouraged at the end of each term if students are finding they are not enjoying, or succeeding, in a given subject.

#### BACKGROUND

Students, when choosing a course of study for the Senior Phase of schooling, are expected to make a wise and considered decision. The choices they make are informed by their past academic performance, personal interest, prerequisites and standards for senior subjects and the requirements for their intended future pathway.

Most students make appropriate choices according to these prerequisites and their ability, based on past academic performance, personal interest and intended pathway. Some students however, against all reasonable advice, information about past academic performance and required prerequisite subjects and standards, make inappropriate decisions. Some students also continue to remain in subjects when their academic performance is consistently below an acceptable standard and will not enable the student to successfully pursue any pathway or achieve a Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

#### PURPOSE

The purpose of this policy and set of procedures is to ensure that students make appropriate decisions regarding a course of study in the Senior Phase of Learning. It is also to ensure students maintain a reasonable standard of academic performance throughout the Senior Phase of Learning, which will effectively contribute to the student being able to attain their chosen future pathway and Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE).

#### POLICY

Students wishing to enter senior subjects must complete the required prerequisite subjects and minimum standards for their chosen senior subjects. All students must also maintain a reasonable standard of academic performance throughout the Senior Phase of Learning, which will effectively contribute to the student being able to attain their chosen pathway.

#### PROCEDURE

- While in Year 10, all students will participate in a Subject Selection Program that will provide support for them to make an informed choice regarding their course of study in the Senior Phase of Learning.
- Required prerequisite subjects and standards will be indicated in the Senior Studies Subject Information Book and published in various forms throughout the year.
- Completion and attainment of the prerequisite subjects and standards will be checked at SET Plan interviews
  and students will be advised, if choices are inappropriate, that they should find an alternative subject to study.
  Where students do not accept this advice and make an inappropriate choice based on the information that is
  available, the advice will be recorded and signed by all parties (parent, student, teacher) and filed with the
  student's senior enrolment form.
- Where students insist that they be able to enter a subject even though they do not have the prerequisite subject and minimum standard, they are to be given Unit 1 to demonstrate they are capable of attaining a **reasonable** academic performance.
- Reasonable academic performance is defined as achieving a Sound (C) achievement or above.
- At the end of Unit 1, the Deputy Principal will review student achievement, and students will be asked to show cause why they should remain in a subject, when their academic performance is not of a reasonable standard.
- Where a student does not meet a reasonable academic performance, they will be supported by advice from the Guidance Officer as to which is an appropriate alternative subject and/or alternative future pathway.
- When the school is putting together the Timetable 'Subject' lines and decisions are being made to offer subjects, the school will take into consideration a student's previous academic performance if it is necessary to select from a list of students who are all wishing to enrol in the same course of study, and there are too many students for the number of classes on offer.

Economics will study a current issue that impacts on the individual; Geography will encompass both physical and human geography with an emphasis on local area issues; Ancient History will compare the true events of Spartan conflict with the Hollywood depiction; Modern History will undertake an inquiry into an issue related to people's Rights and Freedoms, the Environment or Population Culture. Assessment tasks mirror those undertaken in senior Humanities subjects.

Subject overview	This subject will rotate through term-long units on each of the major Sciences – Physics, Chemistry and Biology. Students looking to study a Science in Year 11 and 12 should seek this choice for Year 10. Throughout the three terms you will study things like: Chemistry - periodic table, chemical bonding, chemical reactions, rate of reactions; Biology - genetics and the role of genetic diversity and inheritance; species survival and how natural selection acts as a mechanism of evolution; Physics - takes you from energy conservation, transfers and transformations, to motion and Newton's Laws, and then through to experimentation that/which models real life situations such as what happens during collisions. Engineering, medical sciences or agriculture could be some of the possible career paths from this subject.

Subject overview	Agricultural Science explores the ways that people manage natural resources such as plants, animals, climate, soil and water to meet our basic needs. These management practices come from current understandings about science, food and fibre production systems, sustainable farming practices, agricultural technologies, consumer-driven economics and effective product marketing. Thus, the scope of the subject is very broad, yet very relevant to all students due to the fundamental importance of agriculture to humans. This subject is designed to develop a broad and integrated understanding of agriculture. You will develop understandings and skills through a range of techniques and topics that include: hydroponics and aquaponics, plant production, farming as a business and animal anatomy and physiology.

Subject overview	This course is essential for students aiming for an ATAR in Year 11 and 12. Each term is aligned to at least one of the senior Science ATAR subjects, with an emphasis on further developing the required knowledge and skills, in readiness for the senior phase of learning. The forensics unit will combine the study of biology and psychology (plus a little physics and chemistry). Using a case study approach, students will examine a range of forensic evidence that may be used to build a criminal profile. The Physics unit will investigate simple machines and the forces involved in achieving incredible feats of engineering, while the unit on future materials will explore the development of new, superior and smarter materials, that can be based on biomaterials such as spider silk. The final unit Sustainable Futures will combine Biology and Agriculture to address the key global challenges for resilient food production systems – think drones, remote sensing technology and GMOs.

Eating for Life looks at the factors that influence individuals and families making healthy food choices. It covers lifestyle choices and diseases such as vegetarianism, obesity, diabetes and heart disease as well as allergies and intolerances i.e. coeliac etc. Later in the unit they investigate the advantages of buying produce locally, growing your own food and environmental sustainability practices that can be incorporated into their own families.
